Martin loved sport as a child. He started learning to swim when he was five. When he finished school he became a mechanic. He thought the job was boring. Swimming was his hobby. He went to the local swimming pool but he hated swimming there. He started to swim in rivers and the lake near his home. Then he started doing long distance swimming races and won many times.

When Martin went to the Amazon, his eldest son went with him. His wife stayed at home with the rest of the family. Martin started his swim on February 1st and finished 66 days later. He swam 5,268 km, which is further than swimming the Atlantic Ocean. He swam for 10 hours a day. There are many dangers in the Amazon, such as crocodiles, snakes and piranhas. Martin saw all of them but none of them hurt him. At the end of the swim Martin said, 'I feel fortunate'.
