The Hitchhiking Robot

In 2014, a team of Canadian scientists created *HitchBOT*, a child-sized robot. The scientists wanted to carry out a social experiment designed to answer the question, ‘Can robots trust humans?’ The basis for the test was to see how far *HitchBOT* could hitchhike round the world, travelling with the kindness and help of strangers, while monitoring human reaction to the robot.

HitchBOT was made with easily identifiable arms and legs. Its body was a plastic bucket and above that was a screen displaying eyes and a mouth. It clearly looked like a simple humanoid robot. It lacked the ability to move its legs or arms, however, and so relied totally on human assistance to get around. Despite its basic appearance, *HitchBOT* had some sophisticated technology which allowed it to be tracked on its journey. It took photographs every twenty minutes to document its progress, posting them on social media sites for fans to follow. *HitchBOT*’s energy source came from solar panels and in-car sockets. It was capable of simple interaction and could communicate random facts to entertain its human travelling companions. It also had a wish list of things to do.

Contrary to the scientists’ expectations, its first journey was incredibly successful, with *HitchBOT* completing a 10,000 km trip across Canada in 26 days, having taken 19 different rides along the way. It was taken camping, fishing and even attended a wedding. Interest in *HitchBOT* grew rapidly with thousands of fans following the journey on social media and helping the robot fulfil its wish list of visiting tourist attractions. *HitchBOT* then went to Europe and hitchhiked across Germany and the Netherlands.

In July 2015, *HitchBOT* attempted a coast-to-coast trip across the USA, commencing in Boston. Photos showed it in New York and then Philadelphia but, unfortunately, the robot didn’t make it any further. All connections between the robot and its creators were suddenly lost on the 1st August. Mystery surrounds the exact reason why this happened but vandals have been blamed. *HitchBOT*’s fame, however, has seen no sign of diminishing, with t-shirts bearing its image and a replica robot taking over its quest to see the world.
